INTRODUCTION

Because of the absence of old records, it is extremely difficult to firmly establish the exact birth date of the Society. What is known is that as The Levin Amateur Theatre Society, productions were staged prior to 1914. From the records and knowledge available, it appears that although the Society was an entity from the early 1900s, active pursuit of live theatre was put on hold during the war years of 1914-18, and again in 1939-45. In addition, there is an indication that the Society went into some form of recess in the late 1940s and early 1950s, but was actively pursuing live theatre again in 1956 through to the current day.

In 1983 The Society purchased the old lube bay part of the Levin Dairy Factory. This area was used for costume hire, set building and rehearsals until being sold in 1989 after the purchase of the Society's current home.

Through various ups and downs, the Society has continued its proud tradition of presenting quality live theatre entertainment, with some big-name productions being produced.



MILESTONES

The following is a summary of some of the more significant milestones in the history of the Society:

Early 1900s

The formation of a live theatre group known as The Levin Amateur Theatre Society.

1955

On 8 April a meeting was held in the Levin Regent Hall to discuss the revival of the Society following a period of recess.

On 24 May a meeting of interested people was held with a decision made to revive the Society. Subscriptions were set as I 0 shillings and sixpence and 5 pence for those under the age of 18.

1956

On 22 February, the committee resolve a name change to The Levin Amateur Operatic and Dramatic Society and becomes an incorporated body.

1957

On 30 October proposed name change to The Levin Operatic and Theatrical Society was defeated

1962

On 10 December Society changed its name to The Levin Operatic Society (Inc)

1965

At the AGM on 9 March, a proposal to go into recess was defeated

1966

On 10 March a further attempt was made to put the Society into recess – again this was defeated

1970

On 5 October Society discusses with Little Theatre the possibility of amalgamation. This was unsuccessful.

1982

Society purchases the lube bay and workshop area of the dairy factory complex in Queen Street Levin for approximately \$21,500. Some work done on the building and plans produced to develop into a theatre. Concept not fully pursued, instead the building used for set building and storage.

Society sell its property in McKenzie Street Levin, and pays the council the balance of the outstanding cost for the old lube bay area purchased in 1982.

1988

Society resolves to purchase the old dairy factory building from the council, and now owns, with a mortgage, a run down, dirty and leaking building, full of rubbish and birds.

1989

A start made to convert the old dairy factory into a theatre complex. A four-stage plan drawn up over a 10-year development period after many hours of voluntary labor and the support of local businesses, a usable complex started to become a reality. Amid scaffolding and with two thirds of floor in place, the Society produced Godspell directed by Geoff Turkington in its own home. A theatre was born.

1992

The lube bay and workshop area purchased in 1982/83 were sold, with proceeds used to clear debt, purchase chairs and theatrical lighting.

1995

The AGM of the Society resolves to change its name to The Levin Performing Arts Society Inc. in line with the theatre name of The Levin Performing Arts Centre.

An annual artistic award in association with the Levin Rotary Club introduced with a value of \$500 a year specifically to allow the recipient to further their development in the Performing Arts - open to 15-19-year old's and known as The Jack Lines Artistic Award.

1996

Following discussions with the Council the balance of the mortgage with them made interest free on the balance owing at that time.

1998

With the assistance of a Lottery Board grant and an interest free loan from the NZ Musical Theatre Federation, the Society builds a new committee room and bar facility, using member's voluntary labor.

On 17 May the new extensions were opened by Mrs. Muriel Saulbrey, with 90 members and invited guests in attendance.

1999

The Society assists with the organising for the successful Levin Street Party on State Highway 1 to welcome in the new millennium.

The Jack Lines Artistic Award established with Levin Rotary finishes. A new Youth Artistic award established in partnership with the Horowhenua Creative Communities Committee with a monetary value of \$500.

2004

The Society introduces an awards system to recognise our own performers.

2015

The Society performs the world premiere of Aotearoa, directed by Lorraine Lepper.

2018

The Society performs the New Zealand premiere of Disenchanted, directed by Lorraine Lepper.

2021

The Society decides to re-brand itself with a new logo and the byline "Musical Theatre on Queen", this being a reference to the Society performing musicals and the theatre being situated on Queen Street.

THE BIRTH OF THE LEVIN PERFORMING ARTS CENTRE

The Centre was first used by the Society for live theatre in 1989, with the musical Godspell, directed by Geoff Turkington. Many materials used in the development were recycled from the old Regent Theatre in Levin, and the majority of the current flooring in the Centre is from that source.

A small band of workers, primarily the 1988/89 committee were responsible for the development done in a three-month period that allowed Godspell to take place. Committee members were:

The following is an extract from the local newspaper The Weekly News, published in March 1989 -

Nostalgia will be the name of the game when patrons enter the foyer of the new Performing Arts Centre. The carpet, curtains and ticket box used to be part of the old Regent Theatre and Levin Operatic Society has revived an important section of Levin 'history with their reuse in the new centre. As you carry on into the centre you may even recognise the flooring which also was saved when the old theatre was demolished. Four months ago, it was decided that the major production for the year was going to be Godspell. A more far-reaching decision was for the Operatic Society to perform it in their own theatre which at that stage consisted of a concrete shell.

Since then this small Society with an even smaller budget has converted the old dairy factory into the Performing Arts Centre. With a lot of dedication and a lot harder work, a few people have got the building up to the required standards thus enabling it to be used as a much-needed amenity in the community. Behind the scenes there is still a lot to be done, but the hard work and sacrifices will be well worth it as the end result will be a cultural centre Levin can be proud of.
